Thanksgiving! Christmas!


Yes, the Deacons are already thinking about the holidays. November and December are our busiest months of the year.

The church again serves as a **polling location** on November 4th. We are also home to line dancing classes every Thursday after the pantry. Other groups are looking at our facilities as a


possible meeting location too.
