

#### From the Pastor

With Easter falling on March 31st, we have the unique opportunity to have this entire month dedicated to this season. The season of Lent, of preparation, or reflection, of repentance. The entire month, as the days grow longer (Don't forget to "Spring Ahead" on March 10!), to focus on the cross, on this one event that makes our faith different from all others.



The cross, an ancient instrument of torture, shame, and death, has taken on many different forms. Shown here are just a few examples of this sign of our faith. They each have their own story, their own role to play in Christianity.

The cross, as the primary sign of our faith, has been used in jewelry, in religious art, in clergy stoles and robing. The cross also lends itself for use as an illustration. The following story is from *He Set His Face to Jerusalem*, our Lenten Bible study book.

Contemplate a horizontal line representing the needs of the world. Children are sick - a need for doctors and nurses; people are hungry - a need for food; some folks are nearly naked - a need for clothing; some have never heard about the saving love of Jesus - a need for preachers. Then, crossing

that horizontal line, visualize a vertical line: That's you, with your individual gifts and graces - uniquely you. Where the horizontal line (the needs of the world) crosses the vertical line (your unique abilities) that is where God is calling you.

God does call each one of us to use the gifts and graces given us to help build the Kingdom of

God, to reach out to those in need, to fight for justice and to spread peace. During this month of March, I invite you to contemplate all that God has given you, uniquely you. And look for that point of intersection with the needs of the world. And see just where you make a cross, and listen for just what God is calling you to do, or be, or say. And be blessed, just as you are a blessing. Amen.



#### **Board of Property and Finance**

It's been a long time coming, but the stained glass restoration is just around the corner. Starting April 1, Blanck Studio of Art will begin the removal of our precious Christ Ascending stained glass window. They will carefully remove the entire window from the inside and transport it to their shop in Piqua, Ohio. There they will do a

total restoration of the window by disassembling it, cleaning, repairing and replacing any damaged glass, re-leading, glazing and barring (metal support rods) as needed. Once complete, they will safely transport it back to church and re-install it. The entire operation is expected to last about 8

weeks. The outside protective storm glass will remain in place until the restored window is put back, and then it will also be replaced with new protective glass. Curtains, banners or artwork will be installed to reduce the amount of light coming in and also so that we have something attractive to look at during church services besides attractive Don Pasqualetti. We are open to your suggestions or ideas for this "curtain". Many thanks to those that contributed to the stained glass window fund and to the Ruth Schnier Estate for making this restoration possible.

Tuck pointing of the brick is the next major project. The south side of the old church has already been tuck pointed, so all the remaining sides and towers will be done. All mortar joints will be inspected, cleaned and completely filled with new mortar so that it is flush with the surface of the brick. These areas will also be cleaned and sealed to further protect the

brick and mortar from moisture penetration. Scaffolding will be erected around the building to do this work, which is expected to last about two months. The start date has not yet been determined but we will keep you informed. With the new roof, tuck pointing and sealing we should be well protected from the elements for the coming years. We are so thankful for the Amy Wright Estate for making this work possible.

Workship Day this month will be on Saturday, March 23 from 8am till about noon. Your help is appreciated to perform maintenance of the church.

Our walk-in freezer has seen more than its share of repairs the last few months. It took several attempts by the repair company to find and fix a leak in the refrigeration system.

We hope to see you at our Easter worship services as we lovingly gaze upon our stained glass window knowing that it will be removed for restoration the very next day. A joyous and blessed Easter to all.


