From the Pastor

On November 15, I attended the SONKA (Southern Ohio Northern Kentucky Association) of the Heartland Conference of the United Church of Christ. This was a short business meeting with an injection of worship, and some time to meet and greet. The new Regional Ministers were installed, and Rev. David Long-Higgins brought greetings from the Heartland Conference. And I learned that there are now 68 churches in SONKA - when I arrived here almost 16 years ago, there were at least 84 churches in SONKA. There is a 'Legacy' Ministry, to help churches determine how they are going to transition into a new ministry - perhaps one without a building. And I learned that the grant that Debbie Cummins had written for a Charch and Hale grant was

awarded, and our organ will be tuned as soon as can be arranged!

And, I had the opportunity to meet with Emmanuel. Emmanuel Tuyishime was our student minister back in 2014-15, and he has since been ordained and has been serving in ministry in the Dayton area. Emmanuel is from Rwanda, and his passion is to help refugees

make the transition from one culture to another. He is currently pastoring the New Hope Apostolic Church. Over the past 14 years, his ministry has moved six times, always sharing spaces with other churches. Though God has been faithful, Emmanuel and his leadership team believe it is time for them to have a permanent home where they can build stability, expand their ministries, and create a safe, welcoming place for the many newcomers we serve. With over 120 people in worship, and 52 kids running around, their own space makes sense!

Emmanuel says this about his church and their mission outreach: We are deeply committed to welcoming newcomers to the United States. Our members regularly:

- · Pick up new arrivals from the airport
- Host them in their homes
- Help them apply for Social Security numbers
- · Take them to job centers when eligible
- with immigration paperwork and appointments

We walk with them through the entire adjustment process with compassion and hospitality.

In a time when mainline Protestant churches are in a decline, isn't it refreshing to hear of a church that is growing?! And meeting needs?! The New Hope Apostolic Church has set a goal of \$100,000, and have already raised \$50,000, and are working hard to meet this goal by January 1, 2026. If you would like to be part of this ministry, I invite you to use the labeled envelopes in the narthex and put your support in the offering plate. These envelopes will be available each week in December, and after the last Sunday in December we will make a Happy New Year's gift to Emmanuel and his church fund.

I am also sharing this information within SONKA, especially the Dayton area churches, so that more can be part of this exciting church growth. We are in a covenant relationship with all the churches in SONKA, and I feel that we are in a covenant relationship with Emmanuel as well. We helped train him for the ministry, and his time with us is precious to him. He sends his greetings and love, and asked about many of you by name. Please add him and his church to your prayers, and in this season of love and goodwill, see if God nudges your heart to be part of Emmanuel's ministry.




30. Please come and help out on those days if you are able!

This time of year we always reflect upon the many good things that we have been able to accomplish with the help of all our ministry board and church members and with our Lord Jesus Christ.

The new digital sign is performing well. We have helped to inform the community of upcoming events, not only at our church, but also for other local churches. It has even brought a couple new faces to worship and church activities. And I am sure that Bruce Koehler is rejoicing that he no longer needs to suffer through the changing of the sign information...and we thank him for the many times he updated the old sign.

We have been advised by a forensic engineer, that our mois-

ture penetration issues in the sanctuary are most likely caused by leakage thru the outside edges of our stained glass windows on the side walls. We have had those edges caulked and re-painted with the hopes that this will end those problems. Once we are sure, we will repair and paint the inside walls that are damaged. In the coming months we will also be looking at some additional remodeling of the stained glass façade and lattice panel at the front of the sanctuary.

We have met our \$120,000 goal for our Stewardship campaign. Prayers have been answered and we thank you all for your contributions of time, talent and treasures.

We have received the final construction documents for the installation of new front entry doors. A dark bronze color has been selected for the aluminum doors and all new access hard-
